## (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) THE ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

## **TEMPORARY ORDER DECEMBER 2022**

To allow level crossing renewal works and other associated works to be carried out, Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of Grove Ferry Hill, Upstreet.

Closures are planned from on 4th December 2022 for up to 1 night between the hours of 02:15 and 04:15 and on 5th March 2023 for up to 1 night between the hours of 02:15 and 04:15. The scheduled dates may vary for these works with appropriate signage displayed on site and the works will be displayed on One.Network

Grove Ferry Hill will be closed in the general vicinity of the level crossing, to the extent indicated by signs and barriers on site.

The closure is required for the safety of the public and workforce while level crossing renewal works and other associated works are undertaken by Network Rail Infrastructure Ltd.

The alternative route any through traffic (excluding vehicles over 7.5 tonne) is via Grove Ferry Road, Grove Road, Stourmouth Road, Preston Road, The Street, Plucks Gutter, Gore Street, A253 Ramsgate Road, A28 Canterbury Road, Island Road, Grove Ferry Hill and vice versa.

The alternative route for vehicles over 7.5 tonne is via Grove Ferry Road, Grove Road, The Street, Preston Lane, Preston Road, Preston Hill, A257 Goberry Hill, Roman Road, Pedding Hill, Ash Bypass, Sandwich Road, Each End, A256 Sandwich Bypass, Ramsgate Road, Richborough Way, A299 Hengist Way, Canterbury Road West, A253 Canterbury Road and A28 Canterbury Road, Island Road and vice versa.
